

Community, precinct and neighbourhood schemes

This section outlines the rights and responsibilities of those living and working in a community, precinct or neighbourhood scheme.

Community, precinct and neighbourhood schemes are forms of land title that help in subdividing and developing land with shared <u>association</u> property.
